Investment Policy and Objectives

The investment objective of the STANLIB SWIX40 Exchange Traded Fund is to provide returns that replicate the performance of the FTSE/JSE SWIX40 Index ("the index"), or SWIX40. The Asset Manager achieves this by buying the underlying shares in substantially the same proportions as they appear in the index, and in this way, both the capital and income performance of the portfolio will approximately match that of the index.


While the Manager may purchase derivatives to achieve its investment goal, this is not done in the ordinary course of business.

The dividends that these companies pay accumulate into an income account and are distributed, net of fees, on a quarterly basis.

Quarterly Comments

Fund Review

The STANLIB SWIX 40 Fund is a passively managed index-tracking fund. The aim is to replicate the performance of the FTSE / JSE SWIX 40 Index ("the index") as closely as possible.

The fund is aimed at investors who seek exposure to large cap stocks at a reduced cost. This exposure is achieved by holding the index constituents in their index proportions.

The fund performed in line with the index in the third quarter of 2016. The last quarterly review of the index saw the inclusion of Bidvest Ltd, Gold Fields Limited, Life Healthcare Group Holdings Ltd, Sibanye Gold Limited and The Spar Group Ltd. Exclusions of Anglo American Platinum Ltd, Capital & Counties Property Plc, Capitec Bank Holdings Ltd, Intu Properties Plc and Rand Merchant Investment Holdings Ltd, were effected to the index. This quarter also saw the delisting of SAB Miller. There were changes in the shares in issue of various stocks. Free float factors were also adjusted on a number of stocks. The fund was repositioned for all these changes.

Looking ahead

We continue to maintain a tight tracking error to the FTSE / JSE SWIX 40 Index whilst keeping track of and adjusting for corporate events and index changes as and when they happen.

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Total Expense Ratio, Transaction Costs & Total Investment Charge

Total Expense Ratio (TER): This shows the charges, levies and fees relating to the management of the portfolio and is expressed as a percentage of the average net asset value of the portfolio, calculated over a rolling three years (where applicable) and annualised to the most recently completed quarter. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TERs.

Transaction Costs (TC): The percentage of the value of the fund as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Total Investment Charges (TIC): The percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs, relating to the investment of the Fund. As fund returns are reported after deducting all fees and expenses, these costs (the TER & TC) should not be deducted from the fund returns. It is the sum of the TC & TER.
